Roads Update: Alpes Road to be rehabilitated

Following an outcry by local residents over the dilapidated state of Alpes Road, Harare North residents held a stakeholders meeting with ZINARA representatives. It was noted that ZINARA will rehabilitate a 5km stretch from The Chase juncture all the way down Alpes Road to the Agriculture Research Centre adjacent to Hatcliffe Extension.

The residents agreed to in the meantime to mobilise resources and rubble fill up potholes all the way to Mickey Joe Shops and further down to the Stamps Farm, as a stop gap measure.

Meanwhile the Councillor for Ward 42 Mr E.Ruzani has been pushing for water,waste management and refuse collection from the City of Harare,with the help of Ms Sharon Hook of the Waste Management Department from Miracle Missions. All this work has been done without receiving the Community Development Fund (CDF) from Parliament.

Typhoid scare in Ward 18

There was a typhoid outbreak scare in Masawi Ward 18 which is under councillor Ian Makoni, the Hon Member of Parliament for Harare North rushed there to provide safe drinking water, assist in isolating and hospitalization of the affected people so as to curtail the spreading of the disease.

The typhoid scare at the community in the neighbourhood of the Shamva Road Tollgate was contained and there was no danger of loss of life even though 6 people were admitted in hospital.

City of Harare department of health were simply fabulous from the moment they were advised of the outbreak in the settlement.

The source of infection was suspected to be either the borehole or the Blair toilets that have been over used. This is under investigation and results of analysis should be out soon.

The attempt to remove the waste in the toilets failed as they have caked up. The waste disposal service team ended up using HTH to sterilize and will do so again every few days until

alternative toilets are installed.

There is need for strategic partnerships to construct new toilets in the community. Dr Chonzi, the City Director of Health, kindly offered to pursue MSF and other partners who may be interested in doing such a project.

The borehole was chlorinated and sealed off for a 24 hour period. Until then the residents were issued water. Thanks to MP Markham for mobilizing support in the form of drinking water for the 52 families affected.
